English: Our guided reading text this term will be Stig of the Dump by Clive King

In literacy our writing will be focussing on narrative writing (recreating their own versions of Stig in the Dump) along with fact files. We will also be using our guided reading texts as the inspiration for our writing alongside our topic work.

Grammar is taught in the form of 20 minute morning lessons 3x a week.

Spellings will be tested weekly.

Maths: This term year 3 will be learning about time, shape and statistics. Year 4 will be learning about the same units as year 3 plus an additional position and direction unit. The overview of each unit is available on WhiteRose.

Science: This term we will be learning about Scientific enquiry. They will learn about the key scientific questions they can ask to help them understand experiments and make predictions about what will happen. They will learn key scientific language.

Topic: We will be studying the Stone age to the Iron age. What were the challenges people faced in the early Stone Age? Along with what was the impact of the stone age and Iron age on Britain.

R.E: This term we are going to be studying Humanism. Our key question for this term is , Who are Humanists and what do they value?

P.E: This term will be focusing on Athletics and the three key areas of throwing, running and jumping, this will be in preparation for our sports day.

Art This term our art will be based on caveman paintings. We will use different mediums to try and create hand and finger paintings based around what cavemen would have done.
