What was the social and economic impact of World War 2 on Britain?









Create a fact file to show your findings.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Can you create a game that children in WW2 might have played. Write down the rules so you can teach your friends how to play it.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Challenge</p>  <p>The cracking of the Enigma Code was one of the pivotal turning points. Can you create an unbreakable code which would have allowed you to send secret war time messages. Write a note in your code and see if your friends can decipher it.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Creative</p> <p>We will be building Anderson Shelters at school. However, these weren't the only type of bomb shelter used in WW2. Research the Morrison Shelters and make your own model of one.</p>

Speak to them about their experiences and write an account of some of the things they remember.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Create a timeline to show how WW2 unfolded.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Make do and Mend</p> <p>Material was scarce during the war, so people couldn't just buy new clothes. Can you upcycle an old item of clothing to create something new.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>The war in numbers. Can you create a poster with as many WW2 number facts as you can find. For example, how many children were evacuated? How many soldiers were in the British Army?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Draw a suitcase containing the six most precious things you would take with you if you were an evacuee</p>
